- Offering a warm space in the Church every Thursday.
- Setting up a meeting to look at some of the issues arising in the churchyard
- Setting up a budgeting sub-group to look at addressing our annual deficit.

Normal business from the November meeting will be deferred to the January meeting.

At the ST JOHN'S PCC meeting the following issues were discussed among others

- Ensuring safeguarding training and DBS checks for all volunteers is up to date.
- Timing of worship on the 2nd Sunday of each month.
- The future of GMS (Good Morning Sunday) as attendances were low.
- The Budget for 2023.....

There had been a considerable amount of necessary expenditure on the building in 2022 (new front doors, boilers and hot water supply to the kitchen.) This has used a considerable portion of our financial reserves. WE also have some issues to address from the recent Quinquennial survey of the building. As usual, we are looking at a deficit budget of about £10,000. This means that our income in 2023 will need to grow.

St Michael's - Isaiah 11:1-10

11 A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit. 2 The Spirit of the Lord will rest on him - the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of might, the Spirit of the knowledge and fear of the Lord - 3 and he will delight in the fear of the Lord.

He will not judge by what he sees with his eyes, or decide by what he hears with his ears; 4but with righteousness he will judge the needy, with justice he will give decisions for the poor of the earth. He will strike the earth with the rod of his mouth; with the breath of his lips he will slay the wicked.

- 5 Righteousness will be his belt and faithfulness the sash round his waist.
- ⁶ The wolf will live with the lamb, the leopard will lie down with the goat, the calf and the lion and the yearling together; and a little child will lead them.
- ⁷ The cow will feed with the bear, their young will lie down together, and the lion will eat straw like the ox. ⁸ The infant will play near the cobra's den, and the young child will put its hand into the viper's nest. ⁹ They will neither harm nor destroy on all my holy mountain, for the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea.

¹⁰ In that day the Root of Jesse will stand as a banner for the peoples; the nations will rally to him, and his resting-place will be glorious.

St John's - First reading - Isaiah 35:1-10

- 35 The desert and the parched land will be glad; the wilderness will rejoice and blossom. Like the crocus, zit will burst into bloom; it will rejoice greatly and shout for joy. The glory of Lebanon will be given to it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon; they will see the glory of the Lord, the splendour of our God.
- 3 Strengthen the feeble hands, steady the knees that give way;
- 4 say to those with fearful hearts, 'Be strong, do not fear; your God will come, he will come with vengeance; with divine retribution he will come to save you.'
- 5 Then will the eyes of the blind be opened and the ears of the deaf unstopped.
- ⁶ Then will the lame leap like a deer, and the mute tongue shout for joy. Water will gush forth in the wilderness and streams in the desert.
- 7 The burning sand will become a pool, the thirsty ground bubbling springs.

 In the haunts where jackals once lay, grass and reeds and papyrus will grow.
- ⁸ And a highway will be there; it will be called the Way of Holiness; it will be for those who walk on that Way. The unclean will not journey on it; wicked fools will not go about on it. ⁹ No lion will be there, nor any ravenous beast; they will not be found there. But only the redeemed will walk there, ¹⁰ and those the Lord has rescued will return. They will enter Zion with singing; everlasting joy will crown their heads. Gladness and joy will overtake them, and sorrow and sighing will flee away.

St John's - Second Reading - Matthew 11:4-10

4 Jesus replied, 'Go back and report to John what you hear and see: 5 the blind receive sight, the lame walk, those who have leprosy are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the good news is proclaimed to the poor. 6 Blessed is anyone who does not stumble on account of me.'

7 As John's disciples were leaving, Jesus began to speak to the crowd about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed swayed by the wind? 8 If not, what did you go out to see? A man dressed in fine clothes? No, those who wear fine clothes are in kings' palaces. 9 Then what did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. 10 This is the one about whom it is written:

'"I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you.
