- CPAS On 23rd May there will be online training on Four Ideas to ensure that every child has a chance to explore Jesus led by CPAS staff, please pray that this training will be well received and put into practice through out the church.
- Tearfund Limited access to schooling in Niger. Security concerns continue to limit access to schooling for children in some regions of Niger. This situation particularly affects those who live in remote areas. Many young people are exposed to protection risks, such as child labour, forced marriage and recruitment into armed groups. Pray for God's protection over children in Niger and pray that they have access to the education opportunities they need to thrive.

THY KINGDOM COME Every year between Ascension Day and Pentecost we are encouraged to pray "Thy Kingdom Come." This year we have

arranged 3 prayer walks around our two parishes (keeping near to boundaries as possible). Each walk is quite long but is designed in small sections so you can come for all or part of each. Itineraries will be available in each church over the next couple of weeks to help you plan where you join and leave the walk. They will take place on

Friday 26th May 5.30pm to 8.20pm. Start and finish at St John's. 6.6 miles.

Saturday 27th May 3.30pm to 7pm. Start & finish at St Michael's. 8.2 Miles

Sunday 28th May 2.30pm to 5.40pm. Start and finish at St John's OR from 3.10pm to 6.15 pm. Start and finish at St Michael's. (This is the same circular walk with 2 start points.) Total 7.6 miles.

You will need to bring footwear for potentially muddy paths, clothing appropriate for the weather and anything you need to eat or drink on the way.

#### 1 Samuel 4:1-11

Now the Israelites went out to fight against the Philistines. The Israelites camped at Ebenezer, and the Philistines at Aphek. 2 The Philistines deployed their forces to meet Israel, and as the battle spread, Israel was defeated by the Philistines, who killed about four thousand of them on the battlefield. 3 When the soldiers returned to camp, the elders of Israel asked, 'Why did the Lord bring defeat on us today before the Philistines? Let us bring the ark of the Lord's covenant from Shiloh, so that he may go with us and save us from the hand of our enemies.'

<sup>4</sup> So the people sent men to Shiloh, and they brought back the ark of the covenant of the Lord Almighty, who is enthroned between the cherubim. And Eli's two sons, Hophni and Phinehas, were there with the ark of the covenant of God.

5 When the ark of the Lord's covenant came into the camp, all Israel raised such a great shout that the ground shook. 6 Hearing the uproar, the Philistines asked, 'What's all this shouting in the Hebrew camp?'

When they learned that the ark of the Lord had come into the camp, 7 the Philistines were afraid. 'A god has come into the camp,' they said. 'Oh no! Nothing like this has happened before. 8 We're doomed! Who will deliver us from the hand of these mighty gods? They are the gods who struck the Egyptians with all kinds of plagues in the wilderness. 9 Be strong, Philistines! Be men, or you will be subject to the Hebrews, as they have been to you. Be men, and fight!'

10 So the Philistines fought, and the Israelites were defeated and every man fled to his tent. The slaughter was very great; Israel lost thirty thousand foot soldiers. 11 The ark of God was captured, and Eli's two sons, Hophni and Phinehas, died.

#### Luke 1:26-33

26 In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, 27 to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. 28 The angel went to her and said, 'Greetings, you who are highly favoured! The Lord is with you.'

29 Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. 30 But the angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, you have found favour with God. 31 You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. 32 He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, 33 and he will reign over Jacob's descendants for ever; his kingdom will never end.'
