THY KINGDOM COME Every year between Ascension Day and Pentecost we are encouraged to pray "Thy Kingdom Come." This year we have arranged 3 prayer walks around our two parishes (keeping as near to the boundaries as is possible). Each walk is quite long but is designed in small sections so you can come for all or part of each. Itineraries will be available in each church over the next couple of weeks to help you plan where you join and leave the walk. They will take place on
Friday 26" May 5.30pm to 8.20pm. Start and finish at St John's. 6.6 miles.
Saturday $27^{\text {th }}$ May 3.30pm to 7pm. Start and finish at St Michael's. 8.2 Miles
Sunday $28^{\text {th }}$ May 2.30 pm to 5.40 pm . Start and finish at St John's OR from 3.10pm to 6.15 pm . Start and finish at St Michael's. (This is the same circular walk with 2 start points.) Total 7.6 miles.
You will need to bring footwear for potentially muddy paths, clothing appropriate for the weather and anything you need to eat or drink on the way.

## 1 Samuel 3:1-10

3 The boy Samuel ministered before the Lord under Eli. In those days the word of the Lord was rare; there were not many visions.
${ }^{2}$ One night Eli, whose eyes were becoming so weak that he could barely see, was lying down in his usual place. ${ }^{3}$ The lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the house of the Lord, where the ark of God was. ${ }^{4}$ Then the Lord called Samuel.
Samuel answered, 'Here I am.' ${ }^{5}$ And he ran to Eli and said, 'Here I am; you called me.'
But Eli said, 'I did not call; go back and lie down.' So he went and lay down.

- Again the Lord called, 'Samuel!' And Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, 'Here I am; you called me.'
'My son,' Eli said, 'I did not call; go back and lie down.'
${ }^{7}$ Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord: the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him.
${ }^{8}$ A third time the Lord called, 'Samuel!' And Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, 'Here I am; you called me.'
Then Eli realised that the Lord was calling the boy. ${ }^{\text {a }}$ So Eli told Samuel, 'Go and lie down, and if he calls you, say, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening."' So Samuel went and lay down in his place.
${ }^{10}$ The Lord came and stood there, calling as at the other times,
'Samuel! Samue!!'
Then Samuel said, 'Speak, for your servant is listening.'

${ }^{16}$ As Jesus walked beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. ${ }^{17}$ 'Come, follow me,' Jesus said, 'and I will send you out to fish for people.' ${ }^{18}$ At once they left their nets and followed him. ${ }_{19}$ When he had gone a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John in a boat, preparing their nets. ${ }^{20}$ Without delay he called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men and followed him.
